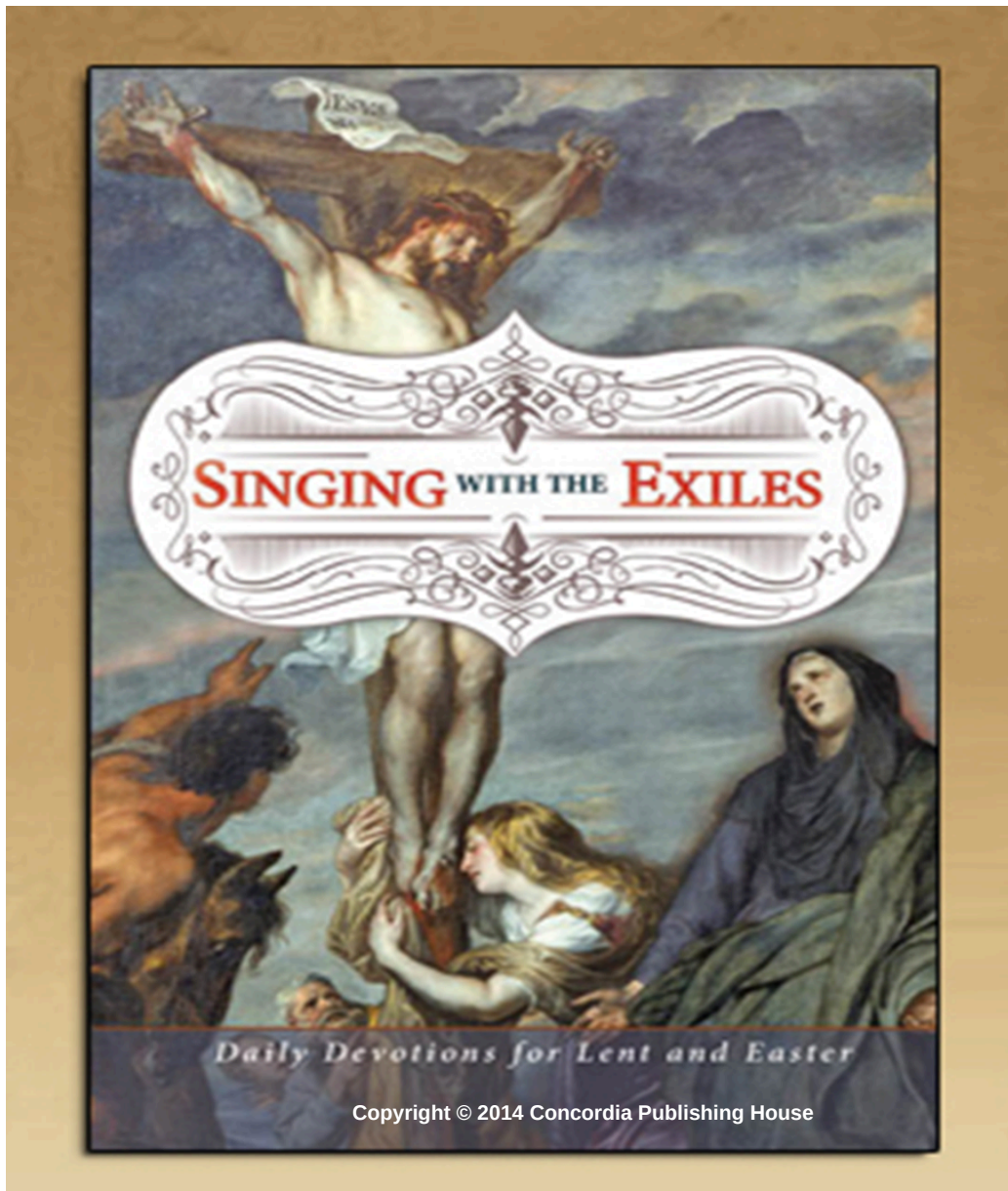

***From the Desk of
Pastor Mews***



LIFE TOGETHER

This February 3-5, I attended Doxology II Conference in Donaldson, IN. Doxology is a ministry that offers continual care training and professional growth for Lutheran pastors. It's my sixth such conference; I've attended four since my arrival at SJL six years ago. This year's conference was "Life Together; Pastoral Care in the Communio Sanctorum".

"Communio Sanctorum" is Latin for "Communion of Saints." One presentation called "The Communio Sanctorum in the Congregation" shared some unique insights that can be a blessing to us. Drawing from Rev. Dietrich Bonhoeffer's classic book, Life Together, the presenter shared threats to the Christian community. These are:

1. Gossip, or the ministry of silence, or holding one's tongue. Even under the guise of will, gossip is the spirit of hatred that creeps in and seeks to create mischief.
2. Arrogance and the ministry of meekness. If one wishes to serve they must think little of themselves. Each person is placed in a community to serve, not to assert themselves.
3. Not being understood, the ministry of listening. Too often people can't have other Christians listen to them, when one is too busy talking. If one doesn't listen to a fellow Christian, often times one does not listen to God. Without listening, there can be chatter and shallow pious words.
4. Lack of purpose or the ministry of helpfulness. A church is a linked chain in which the weakest link serves a unique purpose. The weak need the strong as much as the strong need the weak. Every member is useful and needs a definite task to perform for the community.
5. Unforgiveness/judgment, the ministry of burden-bearing. Each Christian is to bear another's burden; no one is an object to be manipulated. When one carries the burden of another, one experiences the cross and fulfills the law of Christ.

6. Absence of the Word/ministry of proclaiming. The more we hear God's Word with humility and gratefulness, even its admonishments and reproaches, the more we can speak it ourselves.

7. Abuse of power/the ministry of authority and office. There is no cult of personality which elevates the qualities, virtues and talents of another. While these may be spiritual in nature, it has no place in the Christian community and poisons the *Communio Sanctorum*.

8. Communalism/Fellowship for its own sake. This fellowship is not an individual refuge for those running away from personal issues, no matter how spiritual. Such a person is not seeking community, but a distraction to forget his concerns; this can be a poison to community.

9. Individualism. Christianity means community through Jesus Christ and in Jesus Christ; no community is more or less than this. We belong to one another only in and through Jesus. Christianity can only be learned, shared and make sense in a community.

As you read through these, were there any that applied to you? Do you see some of these in our congregation or among family members in the faith? As we mature in Christ, these can become more robust and evident. As sinners and saints, we mature into this. Jesus, through His perfect life, death and resurrection, graciously brings us into this Communion for life on this earth and life forever.

2025 St. John Lutheran Lent and Easter Theme and Worship Services:

Gathered by the waters of Babylon, Judean exiles wistfully wondered: “Is God for real? If so, does He really care about us? What does our future hold? Will this ever change?” God’s people had watched their world shatter into a million pieces. They were demoralized and disillusioned. Their disaster looked terminal.

Do you feel this way? Does it look as though your current problems are more than you can bear? Do you find yourself asking: “Why did this happen? Why did God allow it? Is there any order in the world? Will God really deliver on what He said?”

Isaiah answers these questions in chapters 40–55 of his book. He announces that just when Israel’s history seemed closed and controlled by hopeless Babylonian imperial policy, to the shock and surprise of everyone the Lord will stir up a king named Cyrus and a new exodus will explode in the desert! A Servant will be wounded for our transgressions and crushed for our iniquities. And barren Zion will be given so many children that, like the old woman in the shoe, she won’t know what to do! Standing behind these marvelous promises is God’s almighty Word: “The grass withers, the flower fades, but the word of our God will stand forever” (Isaiah 40:8). The exiles are going home!

That’s why we are “Singing with the Exiles” as they are restored to their home.

This Lent, Isaiah 40–55 will shape us as we . . . “Sing with the Exiles!”

Plan now to sing with the exiles as we learn from Isaiah to walk the Lenten way to the cross and to the empty tomb. God promises to turn our weeping into joy and our present pain into an endless Alleluia!

How Jesus Changed the World

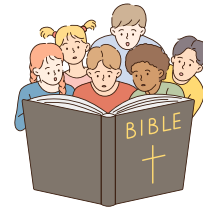

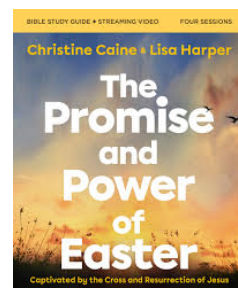


Middle School Bible Study – Led by Mr. Gerken & Mr. Fritz

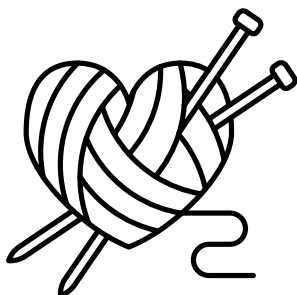

Registration is up and running as we accept applications for next school year for the following ages and grades:

- Preschool 2 - This class is for two year olds with a grown-up and is offered one-half day per week.
- Preschool 3 - Parents can choose to send their three year old child two days, three days, or five days per week.
- Preschool 4 - The children in this age group can attend three days or five days per week.
- Our kindergarten is an all day program that meets five days per week.
- We have first grade, and we are re-opening our second grade program for next year.

For parents of preschoolers three years and older, if you are interested in a full day program, we offer educational enrichment before and after our preschool sessions in the Tiger's Den for an additional fee per day. Tiger's Den is also available for school-age students who attend St. John Lutheran and other schools in the area.

Keep in mind that we have different grant and scholarship opportunities available to help pay tuition fees for both the preschool and the school age programs. Registration packets are available in the school office.

I am especially excited to share more information about our Round-Up Rodeo Open House on **March 15 from 1:00 - 3:00 PM**. We have carnival games, ice cream, snow cones, and popcorn, and a John Deere look-alike bouncy house for the kids. Different ministry programs from our church, such as our Sunday School, Cross Training, Youth Group, Food Pantry, Bible Studies, and more will have information to share at our mini Info Fair. The Health Department, NOCAC, the Ohio OSU Extension Services, the Defiance Public Library, Help Me Grow and other organizations will also be there with goodies to pass out to our families. We've included a flyer about the Open House that you can share with friends and family. Please sign up to help on the enclosed form and return to the school or church office.

Last but not least - please help me spread the word: For the 2025-2026 school year, St. John Lutheran School in Defiance, OH, is seeking a primary elementary teacher, an individual who will embrace our mission which is *to follow Christ's example, and empowered by the Holy Spirit, prepare children for a life of discipleship by helping them grow in faith, knowledge, and character* as he / she exemplifies Christian living and Lutheran Doctrine in and out of the classroom.

DEBORAH S. MAXEY SCHOLARSHIP FUND
(High School Senior)

St. John Lutheran Church and School of Defiance is establishing this Scholarship Program to support and encourage a high school senior preferably entering the field of education. It is NOT a requirement that the applicant is entering the field of education.

This Scholarship shall consist of a grant, the amount of which shall be determined annually by the Deborah S. Maxey Scholarship Committee under the following terms of agreement:

1. The student must have attended St. John Lutheran School for at least 3 years from Kindergarten to Eighth Grade.
2. The student must be a freshman this fall, enrolled and accepted in a college of their choice for an undergraduate program.

The Deborah S. Maxey Scholarship committee consists of a principal, a teacher, and a Maxey family member appointed by the chairman of the St. John Endowment Committee. The grant will be presented at the student's high school awards assembly, if possible.

This scholarship grant shall be remitted to a student upon verification of enrollment into an undergraduate program.

Application for this scholarship should be submitted by the student to the church office by April 6.

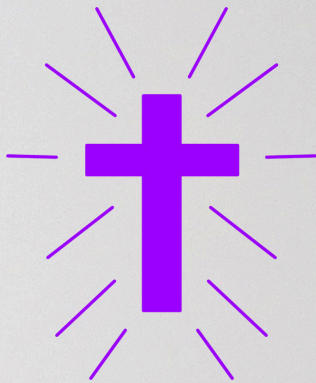
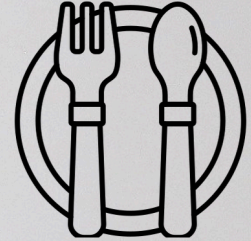
