From the Desk of Pastor Mews



"The Whole World Moves on Hope!"


Many years ago, my family and I vacationed in Ohio during my pastorate in Illinois. A few days were taken to visit Ohio State's football stadium and hike Hocking Hills, and the first stop was at the Columbus Zoo. Outside the primate house filled with all sorts of gorillas, apes, monkeys, chimps and the like was small pavilion. Inside the pavilion was a large bronze gorilla statue in memory of a gorilla whose life blessed zoo guests and staff for decades. On the back wall of that pavilion was a quote. The Columbus Zoo, to educate, include and demonstrate diversity to their guests wrote a number of moving, intelligent and inspiring quotes from people across the diversity spectrum. I read many of them that day. The quote on the wall behind the bronze gorilla was from Dr. Martin Luther. No, not the civil rights hero, but the reformer from whose name comes our church body. There in bold letters were Luther's words. It read, "The whole world moves on hope." Encouraged and inspired, my wife had my picture taken with the solid bronze primate and it has been posted on Facebook ever since. (No comments necessary, thank you!)

"The whole world moves on hope." (Dr. Martin Luther) How true! We all live our lives with the hope, promise and expectation that tomorrow will be brighter and better. As believers, we know that it's true. We were baptized, born into, and given a new and living hope in Christ, the hope of life eternal. There are two things on hope for us to note this month:

1) "CHURCH DOCTORS" SJL CONGREGATION REPORT: Thursday, April 3, 2025, 6:30-8:30 p.m. in the sanctuary. Built upon numerous surveys and personal interviews over the past few months, researching data from our congregation and our Defiance area, the "Church Doctors" will give an extensive report on a Godly way forward both for our reconciliation and our ministry future.

As a member of St. John Lutheran, this is something you don't want to miss. This report can be a compass and set the course of ministry for St. John for years and decades to come. God has a plan for us to reconcile, minister and reach out. This gives us hope, and our ministry is built on hope.

2025 St. John Lutheran Lenten and Easter Themes and Worship Services
Gathered by the waters of Babylon, Judean exiles wistfully wondered: Is God for real? If so,
does He really care about us? What does our future hold? Will this ever change? God's people
had watched their world shatter into a million pieces. They were demoralized and disillusioned.
Their disaster looked terminal.

Do you feel this way? Does it look as though your current problems are more than you can bear? Do you find yourself asking: Why did this happen? Why did God allow it? Is there any order in the world? Will God really deliver on what He said?

Isaiah answers these questions in chapters 40–55 of his book. He announces that just when Israel's history seemed closed and controlled by hopeless Babylonian imperial policy, to the shock and surprise of everyone the Lord will stir up a king named Cyrus and a new exodus will explode in the desert! A Servant will be wounded for our transgressions and crushed for our iniquities. And barren Zion will be given so many children that, like the old woman in the shoe, she won't know what to do! Standing behind these marvelous promises is God's almighty Word. "The grass withers, the flower fades, but the word of our God will stand forever" (Isaiah 40:8). The exiles are going home!

That's why we are "Singing with the Exiles" as they are restored to their home.

This Lent, Isaiah 40-55 will shape us as we . . "Sing with the Exiles!"

Plan now to sing with the exiles as we learn from Isaiah to walk the Lenten way to the cross and to the empty tomb. God promises to turn our weeping into joy and our present pain into an endless Alleluia!

Winter "Life with God"





I had several goals as I planned and organized this Open House. The first was to pull in families from the community and hope they registered their children in school. A second goal was to invite community organizations in to share information about their programs with our school and church families. We met this goal as mentioned in the next paragraph. Another goal was to get church members, school staff, and school families to have fellowship with one another. This happened big time! I could hear the laughs and giggles from one end of the building to the other! Last, I wanted everyone to have something fun to do on a Saturday, especially after a long, never-ending winter. Mission accomplished!

Twelve agencies participated in the info fair portion of our Open House as they shared information about their programs in the Fellowship Room. This group included United Way with its Dolly Parton Reading Program, Defiance Public Library, Cub Scouts, Defiance Co. Health Department, NOCAC, Camp Lutherhaven, LCEF, Defiance Co. Extension Services, SNAP-Ed, Jobs and Family Services with their new foster program, Defiance Co. Bd of DD, and Defiance Co. Help Me Grow. While interacting with this group at the start, one individual told me it would be worth it if they got to help one family. As they were getting ready to pack up, this same person told me it was a success because one family filled out an application for their program's services while visiting their table and was going to qualify for their assistance. This part of our Open House helped us meet the Parent Education requirement that is part of our Accreditation.

Everyone's favorite, including mine, was the John Deere lookalike Big Green Tractor. It was cool looking when I stared at its picture on the internet, but it was AWESOME when up close and personal in our gymnasium! All kids, both big and small, had a blast jumping around inside and then climbing up and sliding down the slide outside the tractor. Of course, they all had to run back around to the beginning and start the fun all over again. We adults really appreciated the pure joy on their faces as they enjoyed their Big Green Tractor experience.

We could not have pulled this event off without the help of school staff, church members, school families, and friends. It made me smile to see all of these different groups of people chatting with each other everywhere I went as they laughed over the antics of the kids. Remember, none of the funds for this came out of the church or school budget. The Endowment Committee gave us funds to pay for the fun and games, LCEF paid for our mailing list and a private donation was used to pay for the invitations and postage. A Thrivent Action Team card was used to pay for the food and paper supplies. And we remained under budget in all areas. Many families said they can't wait until we have another fun event like this one!

Bring donations and come on in and do a little shopping. The CLothes Closet took in \$18,603.34 in 2024. We also helped 60 families with 110 bags of free clothing. The Clothes Closet donated \$1,000 to the Defiance Furniture Bank, \$1,000 to Operation K.A.V.I.C (Keller Assists Veterans In Crisis), and \$50 a month towards missions. 
